- 1. The meeting was called to order at 8:01am by Troy Hawks
- 2. TCC Board Idea Sharing and Updates
 - Jamie Wall (Town of Carbondale Parks and Rec): Potato Day was a success, but we do not have numbers yet. Margaret Donnelly is our new Programs Manager, Kolton Morrison is our new Aquatics Coordinator.

Turkey Trot is on Thanksgiving Day. Save the date for Special Event Task Force on Tuesday, Nov 1st 6pm at Town Hall to recap 2022 events. Then December 6th at 6pm in Town Hall we will approve 2023 events.

- Emily (Comfort Inn Suites) First time slowing down. Facility cleaning and maintenance. Renovating in February. Projections in winter: Quarter 1 looks okay. Rate increase in 2023. Occupancy stay the same. Ski season does not get busy until right before Christmas. September and October much stronger than expected.
- Julie Warren (RVR Golf & Homestead) Branding & marketing. Still open, usually until December. Sledding hill will open when golf course is not open. Homestead closes end of November but continue Christmas parties. Re open in the spring.
- Troy Hawk (Sunlight Mtn) Sale and Ski swap this weekend. Sales are ahead of last year and on track for another record season. Movie night in Glenwood Springs and Rifle. Snow guns will start when there is a stretch of cool weather. December 9th opening date.

Visitors to both museums were down this summer compared to pre pandemic. Next summer will push more advertising. Mostly local visitors. History log cabin started this summer. Clean Up event around the Artway during Farm Fest. Broke ground on the youth art park, project will start this winter and end in the spring. Creative Disctrict Council members held a meeting last night, reviewed the Strategic Plan. Dia De Los Muertos is November First Friday. 4-5:30pm performances on 4th and Main during the event. Deck the Walls beigns Nov 16th for members only, 18th will open to the public. Open through end of December.

Bookkeeper's Summary Report

Period Ending September 30, 2022, Cash Basis

Lodging Tax Report – Town of Carbondale

- Lodging Tax for July 2022 is \$25,117: a 17% increase over July 2021. July 2022 lodging tax is received by TCC in September 2022.
- Lodging Tax for August 2022 (\$20,072) is received by TCC in October 2022, so does not appear on September 2022 financial statements
- 2021 Total Lodging Tax (January-December 2021) is \$165,473

YTD P&L Actuals September 30, 2022 (Blue Column)

- Lodging Tax Income on P&L: \$143,317 Actual vs Budget \$96,000
- September 2022 Lodging Tax Income on P&L (\$25,117) is comprised of lodging tax collected in July 2022
- Total Income: \$143,956 Actual vs Budget \$96,579
- Net Ordinary Operating Income: \$8,806 Actual vs YTD Budget -\$6,853
- Net Income including Other Income & Other Expense: \$16,899 vs YTD Budget \$6,647
- Reserves are budgeted to be funded by an additional \$20,000 in 2022; Opp Fund is budgeted to be funded by \$15,000 at the end of 2022

Balance Sheet as of September 30, 2022 (Blue Column)

- The Operating Checking Account balance is \$98,773 compared to \$122,128 at 09/30/2021
- NOTE: the surplus cash in the Operating Checking Account is intended to be used to cover the 2022 budget deficit (this was reflected in the 2022 budget approval)
- Money Market cash account balance (Opportunity & Reserve Funds combined) is \$114,848 compared to \$73,335 at 09/30/2021
- Reserve Fund Equity account is \$87,986 (includes MM cash account interest earnings)
- Opportunity Fund Equity account is now at \$26,850; Opportunity Fund is budgeted to be fully used in 2022; Opp Fund is also budgeted to be funded by \$15,000 at the end of 2022
- Reserve Fund at 09/30/2022 (\$87,986) covers ~63%, or about 7.5 months, of 2022 Operating Expenses; Reserves
 are budgeted to be funded by an additional \$20,000 in 2022
