5. Financial Review

Tourism Council of Carbondale **Bookkeeper's Report – Executive Summary** Period Ending July 31, 2023, Cash Basis **Lodging Tax Report – Town of Carbondale** 

- Lodging Tax for May 2023 is \$12,788, a 2.4% increase over May 2022
- Lodging Tax for June 2023 is \$19,587, a 7.6% increase over June 2022
- 2022 Total (January-December 2022) is \$199,696, a 21% increase over 2021

• TCC Lodging Tax checks from the Town of Carbondale are received 2 months after lodging tax is collected by Town; the amount is unknown until the Town calculates & mails the check

# YTD P&L Actuals July 31, 2023 (Blue Column)

- Lodging Tax Income on P&L: \$98,364 Actual vs Budget \$102,083
- July 2023 Lodging Tax Income (\$23,354) is comprised of taxes collected in April (\$10,566) & May (\$12,788)
- Total Income: \$100,413 Actual vs Budget \$104,431
- Net Ordinary Income: \$7,752 Actual vs YTD Budget of \$978
- Net Income including Other Income: \$16,455
- 2022 Budget called for funding of Reserves by \$20k & Opportunity Fund by \$15k at year-end 2022

## Balance Sheet as of July 31, 2023 (Blue Column)

- The Operating Checking Account balance is \$103,966 compared to \$108,653 at 07/31/2022
- Money Market & FirstBank CD cash accounts total balance (Opportunity & Reserve Funds combined) is \$131,088 compared to \$114,843 at 07/31/2022
- Opportunity Fund (Money Market account) reduced by \$12,768 part of budgeted contribution to Farm Map Grant expense
- Reserve Fund Equity account is \$108,028 (includes MM cash acct interest earnings); Opportunity Fund Equity account is now at \$21,406
- Reserve Fund at 07/31/2023 (\$108,028) covers ~77%, or about 9 months, of 2023 Operating Expenses
