Bookkeeper's Report - Executive Summary

Period Ending November 30, 2023, Cash Basis

<u>Lodging Tax Report – Town of Carbondale</u>

- Lodging Tax for September 2023 is \$19,668, a 7.9% decrease compared to September 2022
- Lodging Tax for October 2023 is \$15,146, a 3% decrease compared to October 2022
- 2022 Total (January-December 2022) is \$199,696, a 21% increase over 2021
- TCC Lodging Tax checks from the Town of Carbondale are received 2 months after lodging tax is collected by Town; the amount is unknown until the Town calculates & mails the check

YTD P&L Actuals November 30, 2023 (Blue Column)

- Lodging Tax Income on P&L: \$179,115 Actual vs Budget \$160,417
- November 2023 Lodging Tax Income (\$19,668) is comprised of taxes collected in September
- Total Income: \$185,085 Actual vs Budget \$164,105
- Net Ordinary Income: \$34,870 Actual vs Budget \$1,538
- Net Income including Other Income: \$37,384
- 2022 Budget called for funding of Reserves by \$20k & Opportunity Fund by \$15k at year-end 2022

Balance Sheet as of November 30, 2023 (Blue Column)

- The Operating Checking Account balance is \$63,394 compared to \$124,570 at 11/30/2022; this is due to a \$60,000 transfer from Operating Checking to the Money Market Account in Oct 2023
- Money Market & FirstBank CD cash accounts total balance (Opportunity & Reserve Funds combined) is \$192,589 compared to \$99,865 at 11/30/2022
- Opportunity Fund (Money Market account) reduced by \$12,768 part of budgeted contribution to Farm Map Grant expense
- Reserve Fund Equity account is \$108,028 (includes MM cash acct interest earnings); Opportunity Fund Equity account is now at \$21,406
- Reserve Fund at 11/30/2023 (\$108,028) covers ~77%, or about 9 months, of 2023 Operating Expenses

- Reserves at 108K to date covers 6.5 months

Michael Deck the Walls open through 12/24 great year to date; planning for January First Friday (1/5 Family Skate Night); Valley Visual show opens mid-January; Call to Artists for storage unit at gateway to Town (5 murals/3 sculpture) installed by spring extension of Artway; slow construction of Youth Art Park w/ help from Colorado Extreme (early Jan inspections); looking at Grant from Creative District (OEDIT) to support local art businesses
- d. **Erkko** overall observation: restaurants and businesses picking up
- e. **Julie** no longer w/ Homestead and Golf Course; restaurant is closed for season during transition, Steve Van Dyke taking over (joining Chamber board); pass sales available and indoor sim open for indoor golf
